The successful event ended on a good note and we hope that our member companies found potential candidates for the available vacancies.










DIGITALISE YOUR TRADE PROCESSES WITH NETWORKED TRADE PLATFORM (NTP)


24 June 2022

n collaboration with Singapore Customs, SAAA hosted the virtual webinar titled, 'Digitalise Your Trade Processes with NTP' on 24 June 2022.

The webinar introduced the services on the Network Trade Platform (NTP) and its key focus areas: Facilitating trade through government-to-government digital connectivity; streamlining business-togovernment processes to facilitate and enhance traders' compliance with regulatory requirements; and enabling re-use of Government trade data for better decision making or regulatory compliance.

The session concluded with a sharing on how exporters can transmit Preferential Certificates of Origin electronically to China through the NTP, and how the Permit Return service on NTP facilitates data re-use for trade and compliance purposes. CBTA DANGEROUS GOODS (DG) SHARING 19 July 2022

AAA joins the collective efforts of CAAS in increasing the members' community awareness on the mandatory establishment of revised Dangerous Goods training courses which include the competency-based training and assessment (CBTA) framework by 1 January 2023.

On 19 July 2022, Ms Pauline Tok, SAAA Executive Director, had joined the CAAS Safety Series as a guest speaker and shared on her journey in the development and implementation of training programmes, in compliance with IATA guidelines.

In July and August 2022, SAAA Cargo Services Pte Ltd, the training arm of SAAA@ Singapore, had successfully conducted a series of sharing sessions: "CBTA Dangerous Goods sharing" and "SAAA-IATA DG CBTA for H6.1". The participants gained a better comprehension of the CBTA implementation as a whole and the discussions had been fruitful and enlightening. This will be followed by an upcoming event in October titled, "Airfreight Community Reconnect 2022".

These sessions are the first physical events the Association has conducted ever since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic. The members community can look forward to more upcoming physical events as the Little Red Dot eases on the regulations.
